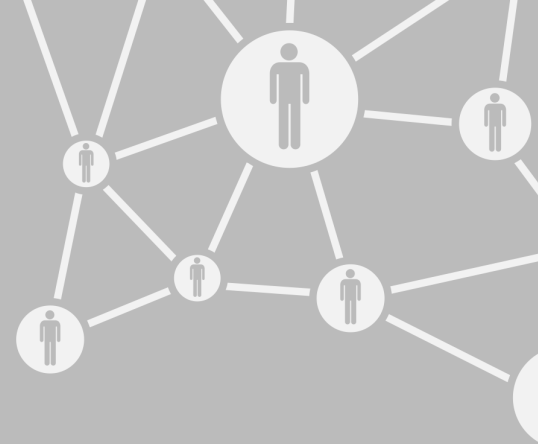

'Yes' Scam Calls Targeting Employees

NOTE!



Several employees have recently reported receiving calls on their work phones that appear to come from a Rowan University number. During these calls, the caller poses a question that would prompt a "Yes" response, such as "Can you hear me?" or "Am I speaking to John Doe?" When the recipient of the call answers "Yes," the caller hangs up.

These calls are alleged to be part of a scam the federal government has issued warnings about that records the voice of the person who answers the call. The scammers, according to officials, may later attempt to use that recording for fraudulent purposes; for example, by using your "yes" response as proof that you agreed to a purchase or credit card charge.

Our recommendation is that if you receive this type of call, immediately hang up. If you suspect that you may already have fallen victim to this scam and responded "Yes" to any of their questions, keep an eye out for any suspicious charges on your accounts. While there are not widespread reports of scammers using these recordings to make fraudulent charges with the few companies that allow voice verification, it's better to be extra vigilant. Get Free Software, Training in MATLAB Portal



Rowan University now offers a campus-wide license for MATLAB that allows students, faculty and staff to download MATLAB and Simulink software through an online portal. Through the Rowan University MATLAB portal, students, faculty and staff may also access free training, contact support and discover additional resources.

Access Rowan University MATLAB Portal

1. Go to the Rowan University MATLAB Portal at go.rowan.edu/matlab
2. Click **Sign in to get started** under the Get MATLAB section and log in with your Rowan Network username and password
3. You will be asked to create a MathWorks Account. Once you do that, you will be associated with Rowan University's MATLAB license and will be able to:
 - Download and activate software on your personal computer
 - Start using MATLAB Online, which provides access to MATLAB from any standard web browser

Existing MATLAB users are also encouraged to download the latest version of MATLAB from the portal. Existing software licenses will continue to work but updating your software will ensure you have access to all of the benefits of the University's new campus-wide license.

New Policy Affects Rowan Network and Email Access for Alumni

Rowan University adopted a new policy in May that affects how long alumni maintain access to their Rowan Network and email accounts when they graduate from the University.

Per the [Alumni Offboarding Policy](#), Rowan University graduates will only maintain access to their Rowan Network and email accounts for 12 months following graduation.

The Alumni Offboarding Policy is intended to help protect University data by only providing active students, faculty and staff with access to Rowan Network resources. This new policy was developed by the Division of Information Resources & Technology and the Offices of Alumni Engagement and Internal Audit after an internal review of how the University manages access to various systems.

In April, we detected and blocked 126 virus attacks and 86,100 emails with malicious URLs sent to our network.
